The Engine of a SEPAC

A good structure is the engine of the SEPAC:

- Mission Statement
- Well-organized framework/By-laws
- Clearly defined roles/Officers
- Meeting requirements Agendas
- Elections and Turnover



Parent input is the fuel for the engine.

Tap into Diverse sources. Input can be used to identify systemic issues <u>and</u> solutions.

- Surveys
- Host a Listening Night
- Dedicated Email for input
- Present to PTA/PTO
- Workshops

Determining Priorities

Not every concern is a systemic issue.

Focus on 1 to 3 critical issues annually to direct your SEPAC's efforts.



Taking on too much can overwhelm volunteers. Leave room for issues that may arise.

Report on a periodic basis to School Committee.

- Requests for input by school leaders
- Positive feedback from parents/stakeholders
- SEPAC advice is considered
